

Topic: Creating an e-book that tells the stories of Nasrettin Hoca in Turkish Culture

Duration: 40 minutes

Grade Level: Middle School-High School

Learning Objectives / Outcomes:

By the end of the lesson, students will be able to:

1. Navigate the website **BookCreator.com**.
2. Upload a PDF and convert it into an interactive eBook.
3. Add text, images, audio, and page design elements inside BookCreator.
4. Export the eBook as an online book or downloadable file.
5. Convert the created eBook into a **flipbook style** using a free online tool.
6. Demonstrate digital publishing and basic design skills.

Materials:

- Computers / tablets with internet access
- Projector / Smartboard
- Sample PDF file ready for use
- Website: <https://bookcreator.com/>
- A free flipbook converter (e.g., AnyFlip, Heyzine free plan, or similar)
- Headphones (optional, for recording audio)

**INTRODUCTION
(10 minutes)**

1. Warm-up (3 minutes)

Teacher asks:

- *"Have you ever read an online book or flipbook?"*
- *"What makes digital books different from printed books?"*

Show a quick example of a flipbook page-turning animation.

2. Lead-in to Topic (2 minutes)

Write on the board:

"Create Your Own eBook Today!"

Explain that students will learn how to turn a normal PDF into an interactive eBook using BookCreator.

3. Short Explanation (5 minutes)

Teacher briefly introduces BookCreator:

- A free online tool for designing simple eBooks
- Allows adding text, images, voice recordings, links
- Books can be exported and turned into flipbooks

Show the BookCreator interface on screen.

<p>DEVELOPMENT (20 minutes)</p>	<p>DEVELOPMENT (20 minutes)</p> <p>1. Demonstration – Using BookCreator (7 minutes)</p> <p>Teacher models the steps:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Go to bookcreator.com 2. Sign in (Google, Microsoft, or email login) 3. Click “New Book” 4. Choose a layout (portrait / square / landscape) 5. Click “Import” → Upload PDF 6. See the PDF pages automatically inserted 7. Add text, stickers, shapes, or audio on pages <p>Students follow along on their devices.</p> <p>2. Student Activity – Create Your eBook (8 minutes)</p> <p>Students:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Upload their sample PDF 2. Add: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ A title on the cover ○ At least one image ○ A short audio narration or text description ○ Background color or design 3. Save their book inside BookCreator <p>Teacher assists groups.</p> <p>3. Converting to Flipbook (5 minutes)</p> <p>Teacher demonstrates:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Click “Publish Online” in BookCreator 2. Copy the share link 3. Go to a free flipbook tool such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Heyzine (free, no time limit) ○ AnyFlip (free basic plan) 4. Paste the link or upload the exported PDF 5. Generate the flipbook 6. Preview the 3D page-turn animation <p>Students try with their own book.</p>
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<p>CLOSING (10 minutes)</p>	<p>CLOSING (10 minutes)</p> <p>1. Reflection (5 minutes)</p> <p>Students answer in writing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>“What was the easiest part of creating an eBook?”</i> • <i>“What was the most challenging?”</i> • <i>“Where can we use flipbooks in school?”</i> <p>Share a few responses.</p> <p>2. Final Summary (5 minutes)</p> <p>Teacher reviews:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How to use BookCreator • How to turn a PDF into an eBook • How to convert into a flipbook <p>Encourage students to finish and publish their books at home.</p>
